New ECB Helmet Guidance

Preston Cricket Club will gradually replace its existing stock of junior helmets and it is possible that some helmets in use this year will not meet the latest guidance. If you have any concerns, please speak to one of the coaches. If you are considering buying your own, we recommend that it meets the new standard, which should be clearly displayed on the helmet.


Personal Safety Equipment



Preston Cricket Club supply all cricket equipment required for our junior sessions however there are some personal protective items that parents should buy for their children especially for those aged 9 or older who may be using a hard ball.

A cricket protector and cricket briefs are essential pieces of kit and compulsory when batting or wicket keeping against a hard ball. They can be bought relatively cheaply from Elite Sports in Hitchin or numerous internet based sports shops.





If rain stops play...
